I opened it this morning to read where I left off and read the line that I had marked, which said, "*Old age is not a reason to leave the battle.*" That made me remember something that happened six years ago now to be exact. Tracy, Juanita, and Esmerelda, and several others went to an Unbound Conference in Pennsylvania. On Saturday night, Matt Lozano said, "We are not going to do what we had on the schedule tonight because God says we are not supposed to. We are going pray with each other. Get into groups of three or four and pray with one another. Do not do Unbound, just pray." So, I got into a group with people I did not know. For some reason, they decided to pray with me first, probably because they felt I needed the most. One woman who had never seen me before, looked at me and said, "God says, 'I am not done with you yet.'" I think those two things: "*old age is not an excuse to leave the battle,*" and, "*I am not done with you yet,*" is what God would say to each one of us. We worship a God, who we know is very good at paradox. He is very good at bringing life out of death, joy out of sorrow, and peace out of bitterness. We know that in the abstract, but do we really know that is what he wants to do in each one of us who sometimes feels old and useless. He wants to bring youth and joy. The best weapon to fight this battle is the joy of the Lord, for that is our strength.
