My tenure with CCGD has shone a bright light upon many men and women who have tried their very best to live this prayer. We can stand upon their example and continue to say Yes. A new generation of young people and young families are counting on us to continue to be examples of a people who, while acknowledging this as a challenging prayer, are not afraid to proclaim it, put it into practice each day, ask for forgiveness when we fail, and recommit day-after-day to living it to the fullest.
