<u>Reflection</u> - We have powerful readings to reflect on today. The second reading (1 Jn 4:7-10) lays the foundation explaining to us that God is Love and His love is revealed in His Son Jesus. John exhorts us to love one another because He has loved us first. Love within a family is natural, but for me the witness of Community has been a witness that God calls us to love everyone. Growing up in God's Delight I witnessed so many people loving, serving, sacrificing for others. Love was poured out without question. The love within our Community appeared

stronger than what I saw members had with their traditional families. What was it that built these strong bonds of love?

What I observed was repeated selfless acts of love...so many people, not doing what was in their own self-interest but, dying to self by focusing on what others needed and loving them through selfless service. This is what Jesus asks of us in the Gospel today ( $\underline{\text{Jn 15:9-17}}$ ) ... to lay down our lives for one another and keep His commandments.

This has always been the blessing of the Community. It is not a place where we can be served but it is a place where we can serve. Community is a safe place where we can lay down our lives for one another and practice really living His Word. The closer one draws to Community the closer we will see His loved poured out. But we cannot sit back and wait for it to happen. We must draw close to one another, in small groups, in bible studies, in pastoral care relationships, in service opportunities... Yes, it has been hard this past year to draw close, but this remains our ongoing challenge...to befriend Jesus by loving those He has called us into relationship with.

This is what drew me into a deeper relationship with Our Lord and what He continues to call us to as members of the Christian Community of God's Delight. We are to be His People, His Witnesses through our love for one another! When we respond, when we say yes to Him, we become part of His plan and His Spirit flows through us to accomplish the impossible. This is what Peter witnessed in the first reading (Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48). When we surrender and let Him, we will see His Holy Spirit descend and His Will be manifest. Miracles that will astound. This is what we are called to, to be His Delight, to lead as many as possible to experience the love of the Father, and into a personal relationship with Jesus through the power of His Holy Spirit. Let us say Yes together today.

Let us pray "Heavenly Father, I repent for the many times I have not loved as You have called me to. I know You are love and call me to love. I ask for a special outpouring of Your Holy Spirit today so that I can love as You love. I recommit to remaining in You. I recommit to keeping Your commandments. I recommit to

loving those You have sent into my life especially my family and my covenant sisters and brothers. Astound me today with Your presence as I surrender every moment to You. I love You, I praise You, I am ever grateful and thankful for Your abundant love! Amen."
