Reflection - Today is the Feast of the Holy Family and all the readings focus on being and living as family. It is rightly said that the family is the building block of society. We fanned out marriage enrichment and other programs to build strong marriages. We fanned out our version of Growing Kids God's Way to raise Godly children. And that was not a bad thing because, the stronger we became individually and as a Community we were able to give back, give to our families, our local churches, and serve those in need.
